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RE: Dublin Mountains Project An Bord Pleanala Application (Ref. JA0040)

We object to the proposed Dublin Mountains Visitor Centre development at Coillte's Hell Fire and Massy's Wood forest properties on the following grounds;

- 1. The outline operational plan included in Section 5.4.2.1 in the Environmental Impact Assessment Report does not provide adequate detail of the management of the visitors to the site. In fact it dismisses the possibility of any "disturbance, litter, trespass damage, or upset to animals or neighbours by visitors to the facility" without providing any quantifiable justification for this statement. As a local resident and farm owner we have first-hand experience of how the current visitors to the area behave and how trespassing and attacks on animals is currently handled by Coillte. Please see attached correspondence from Coillte regarding recent attacks on our animals and by default our livelihood.
- 2. The outline Operation Management Plan lists a management steering group formed of the South Dublin County Council (SCCC), Coillte, and the Dublin Mountain Partnership (DMP) that will manage the site. The list of responsibilities listed provides no clear method or responsible party to oversee the visitors to the site. And from our previous experience with Coillte and DMP they have no method of enforcing the site rules/regulations. Please see attached correspondence from DMP confirming this. We were disappointed to see no details of how they propose to manage +300,000 visitors to the area.
- 3. During public consultations Coillte's used examples of other forest park facilities such as Dun a Ri on the Cabra Estate and Avondale Forest Park they manage as models for this development. However, these facilities are located in remote areas with no regular shuttles from populated areas. We feel these are not a suitable management model and their outline operational plan provides no details of Park Rangers or similar like councils and OPW implement in urban recreational parks.

Given the sensitivity of the site and radical the nature of the proposed development, we feel this proposal needs to be openly discussed and evaluated at a public oral hearing, as there will never be a second chance to remedy mistakes.
